Practice Overview

He is also a qualified mediator.

Agriculture & Rural Affairs

John is a very experienced adviser and advocate and has practised in the area of agriculture and rural affairs for

over 25 years. He is ranked in Band 1 for both real estate litigation and chancery in Chambers UK and is one of Legal 500's leading individuals.

John recently acted for the successful party in *Churston Golf Club v Haddock* [2018] EWHC 347 (Ch) which established for the first time that fencing easements can be created expressly.

Mediation

John became a fully-qualified mediator in early 2015 and now specializing in mediating property, private client and related areas. He also lectures on aspects of mediation law and practice to solicitors in the South West and Wales. John is the Head of Property at St John's Chambers and a barrister with nearly 25 years' experience, almost entirely in the areas of property and private client.

John has a good success rate for achieving settlements at mediation. His style is friendly but direct and incisive. The qualities he most values in the mediation process are judgement, common sense and practicality. He looks to

help the participants identify at an early stage what they can achieve from the process and explores ways in which they can do so.

In particular he applies his knowledge and expertise to help them evaluate their own case, where appropriate and identify their real interests in order to achieve a principled and pragmatic solution.

Professional Negligence

John is a very experienced adviser and advocate and has practised in the area of professional negligence for over 25 years.

John's professional negligence specialism is closely linked to his main area of practice, specifically cases involving Real Estate and associated litigation.

The sort of work John undertakes includes the following:

- ▶ Conveyancing claims arising out of the purchase/sale of land. These include mistakes relating to pre-contract enquiries, searches, filing at HM Land Registry, failing to advise and drafting defective overage terms, options and restrictive covenants and the defective implementation of options.
- ▶ Claims against surveyors/valuers based on negligent investigations and valuations.
- ▶ Conveyancing claims concerning leases. For example, failing to obtain consent to assign/sublet, failing to register leases, failing to advise as to rent reviews and break clauses and the defective implementation of break clauses.
- ▶ Claims arising from the conduct of litigation claims generally involving land.

Real Estate

John is very well versed in handling a variety of complex cases, and is frequently instructed on behalf of estates, developers, public authorities as well as private clients. He is ranked as a Star individual in Chambers UK for real estate litigation, as well as being one of Legal 500's leading individuals.
